
Participation Information

- 64 programs offered
- 42 programs facilitated (66%)
 - 157 sessions facilitated
- 82% overall program attendance rate

- 197 unique participants
 - **64** participated in multiple programs
 - 173 participants attend a town school
 - 24 participants are homeschooled

Participant Outcomes

Self-Esteem

94%

Reported the program helped them understand it is okay to be themselves (117/125)

91%

Reported the program helped them to feel good about themselves more often (99/109)

Resilience

93%

Participants reported they are more willing to try again if something they do does not work (107/115)

Interpersonal Skills

73%

Participants reported they are better at telling others about their feelings (63/86)

86%

Participants reported they are better able to work with others on a team (59/69)

- 100% parents stated the program their child or teen attended has helped them to feel good about himself/herself (82/82)

Trends Observed

- Small group sizes have continued to foster trusting interpersonal connections and peer support among participants
- Higher percentage of registration and attendance by elementary aged children compared to youth
- Previous participation in programs has built a trusting relationship resulting in participants now being more willing to openly and actively engage in explicit SEL teachings and conversations
- Positive feedback about the types of programs and their impact in their communities has been provided by various community members and agencies throughout the year
- A lot of positive feedback that participants and parents want more programing
