Hesketh Community Hall (1925 – 2025) 100th Anniversary Celebration

Brief Project Description: Purchasing replacement tables and chairs for our existing ones that have aged out and are desperately needing replacing

Detailed Project Description:

History – The hall was initially built as the centre of activities for the local residences and the surrounding communities. It provided a social centre for 4-H, community potlucks, Farmers Union of Alberta (FUA) meetings, Women's Institute meetings, and the school's Christmas concerts were annual hosted in our hall. It was a hub of activities, including church service, Alberta Wheat Pool regional events throughout the years. The social events were all about bringing families and the community together for meals, dances, bingos etc. It also served for many years as a polling station for the county, and provincial and federal elections.

Today we have continued in a number of these activities bringing together for family reunions, anniversaries, annual 'heritage' picnics as well as being available for various private function when the hall is rented.

Not only preserving our rich historical heritage but the current community togetherness, this grant will help ensure our ability to provide these types of events for many years to come. That is why we are asking for your help in readying our hall for our $100^{\rm th}$ Anniversary Celebrations planned for this June

Need: the current furniture has aged out! Chairs and tables are in significant disrepair and are also very heavy for handling and awkward for storing. More modern tables and chairs will provide a MUCH NEED increase for capacity and comfort for our events.

Grant Request: we are asking for a total of \$7,369.00 from the County to help us meet our 100^{th} Anniversary Celebration goals.
